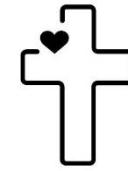




# Knowledge Mat - Christianity (Jesus)

Focus Question: What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus?

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

commitment	Dedicating yourself to something, like a person or a cause.
discipleship	For Christians, this means being a follower of Jesus Christ.
qualities	Distinguishing features that can be good or bad.
attributes	A quality or characteristic given to a person, group, or some other thing.
influence	The power to have an important effect on someone or something.
revelation	The disclosing of some form of truth or knowledge through communication with a deity or other supernatural entity or entities.
charisma	A way of being that draws other people to you and makes them want to be around you.
incarnation	'made flesh'; it is the Christian belief that God became a man in the person of Jesus; fully human and fully divine. God becoming human in the form of Jesus.

## Key Knowledge:

A disciple is someone who believes in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour, intentionally learns from Him, and strives to live more like Him. Discipleship is a journey of spiritual growth.



The Bible teaches us that the original apostles of Jesus were: Peter; James; John; Andrew; Philip; Judas Iscariot; Matthew; Thomas; James, the son of Alphaeus; Bartholomew; Judas Thaddeus and Simon the Zealot.

Mother Teresa joined a community of nuns in Ireland in 1928 called the Sisters of Loretto. Weeks after joining the nunnery, she sailed to India and for the next 17 years, she taught at a school in Calcutta which was run by the Sisters of Loretto.

In 1946, Mother Teresa decided to spend her life helping the sick and the poor. She studied nursing and started working in the slums. In 1948, she founded the Missionaries of Charity, a religious order of women dedicated to serving the poor. This charity opened schools for children and centres to treat the blind, the disabled, the old and the dying.

In 1979, she received a Nobel Peace Prize for helping to relieve the sufferings of the poor. She is now named as a saint of the Roman Catholic church.
