

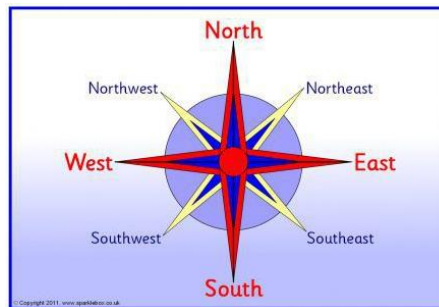
## How does this link to GROW?

### Subject Specific Vocabulary

compass	a tool for find direction; the needle, which can spin freely, always points north.
region	an area of land that has common features; can be defined by natural or artificial features, language, government etc.
United Kingdom	an island country of western Europe. It consists of four parts: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
topography	the study of shape and features on the surface of the Earth; these typically include natural formations and manmade features.
land use	the function of land (what it is used for); varies from area to area.
erosion	water, wind, and other natural forces cause rocks and earth to wear away. These forces also move bits of rock and earth to new places.
country	land that is controlled by a single government; they can be large or small.
city	larger than a town, usually with a population of over 100,000 people; cities are also home to a wealth of shops and services, such a school, universities, hospitals, offices and often a cathedral.
town	a larger settlement than a village; more people live in a town - normally a couple of thousand.
village	a small settlement that can have between 100 and approximately 3000 people.

You can remember the 4 main compass points using a pneumonic, e.g.

Never Eat Shredded Wheat

Some counties local to us are: West Lancashire, Merseyside, Greater Manchester, Cheshire, and Lancashire.
