covenant	a binding agreement or promise between two or more parties (people or groups)

commandment	a rule or law; often religious (like the Ten Commandments)

Key Knowledge:



It is believed that the Torah was given to **Moses** when God made a covenant with the Jewish people after they had been freed from slavery in Egypt. The Torah scroll is respected and no one is allowed to touch it with their bare hands.

The Torah contains 613 **mitzvah** (commandments) which teach Jews how to live their lives. Stories from the Torah all have lessons for Jews and help guide them.

A mitzvah (plural: mitzvot) is a commandment, traditionally understood to come from God and to be intended for the Jewish people to observe.

The Torah contains 613 mitzvah (commandments) which teach Jews how to live their lives. Stories from the Torah all have lessons for Jews and help guide them. One of the rules is that Jewish people should learn about and study the Torah throughout their lives.
