'Learning and growing together to achieve our best in the love of God' sums up our school vision and ethos that all children will have the opportunity to experience God's love and fulfil their potential across the curriculum, valuing themselves and others, living out our Christian values in order to make a positive difference in the world. This vision underpins our behaviour policy.

School Aims

In order to prepare today's children for tomorrow's challenges, Rainford CE Primary Schools aims to achieve the following:

- Every child will be encouraged to understand the meaning and significance of faith, experience God's love and develop the spirituality to enable them to live out our Christian values of love, joy, peace, friendship, forgiveness, perseverance and justice
- Every child will achieve their full potential through being a highly motivated, resilient and independent learner who embraces new experiences, has confidence to tackle challenges and go onto develop a lifelong love of learning.
- Every child will value themselves as a unique individual with special qualities and strengths developing self-discipline and honesty; taking responsibility for their own actions and appreciating their ability to make a positive difference in the world.
- Every child will appreciate and respect others, celebrate differences between individuals and groups and respect and care for God's creation and the environment.
- Every child will be encouraged to make healthy choices and appreciate the benefits of a healthy lifestyle.

In order to do this, we will constantly reflect the Christian ethos of our school in our relationships with our children, their families, our staff, the church and the wider community.

Aims

The sleep policy aims to provide a clear framework to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of all children who require support to sleep or rest whilst in our care. Little Garden Nursery ensures that all children receive the rest and sleep that they need during their nursery day and regard it to be a highly important part of their personal and developmental needs

Legislation

This policy is based on the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage Statutory Framework 2025 for group and school based providers.

EYFS states:

“Sleeping children must be frequently checked to ensure that they are safe. Being safe includes ensuring that cots and bedding are in good condition and suited to the age of the child.”

(EYFS 2025, paragraph 3.84)

As Little Garden Nursery admits children from their second birthday, this policy focuses on safe rest, supervision and environment for children aged 2–4 years.

This policy is also informed by:

- NHS health and safety guidance
- Lullaby Trust safer sleep information (where relevant)
- Keeping Children Safe in Education

Introduction

We operate a Safe Sleep Policy that specifies the “back to sleep” position. Our Policy requires that the key person must discuss and share the Safe Sleep Policy with a child’s parent or guardian before admission. Parents must sign a statement that they have received a copy of the policy.

All key persons working in our nursery are required to receive induction training on the Safe Sleep Policy. When introducing or sharing the policy with our parents the following will be discussed:

- Ask about the child’s sleep position at home
- Where a child has a medical condition affecting sleep or supervision, this will be recorded in their individual care plan and shared confidentially with relevant staff.
- Provide parents/carers with a copy of the Lullaby Trust UK Safe Sleep Guidance

Safe Rest and Sleep Procedures (Children Aged 2–4)

Staff follow these procedures to ensure children rest safely:

Supervision and monitoring

- Sleeping children are visually checked at least every 10 minutes.
- Checks may be more frequent for new starters, unwell children or those with additional needs.
- Staff check breathing, colour, temperature, sleep position and general safety.
- All checks are recorded in real time on the sleep monitoring chart.
- A member of staff remains in the sleep area or within sight or hearing distance at all times.
- Sleep records are monitored by the Early Years Lead or Headteacher.

Sleep environment

- Children rest on a clean, firm mat or bed appropriate to their age.
- Mats are spaced to allow safe movement and supervision.
- No loose items, cords or hazards are within reach.
- Blankets, where used, are kept below shoulder height.
- Children's faces remain visible at all times.
- Sleep areas are calm, well-ventilated and appropriately lit to maintain supervision.
- Equipment is checked regularly to ensure it is clean and safe.

Temperature and clothing

- Staff ensure children do not become too warm.
- Rooms are maintained at a comfortable temperature (around 16–20°C where possible).
- Excess clothing or heavy bedding is avoided.

Settling children

- Children are settled by familiar staff where possible.
- Calm reassurance or quiet music may be used.
- Children who do not sleep are offered quiet rest activities.

Waking children

Children will not be woken unless required for safeguarding, medical reasons, emergencies, or agreed parental arrangements.

Health and Safety Procedures

When supporting children who require a sleep staff will ensure the following health and safety measures are followed:

- Mat beds are cleaned with antibacterial wipes once a child has finished sleeping
- Used bedding should be placed in the covered box marked – 'used bedding' and washed daily in non-biological washing detergent.

- Torn or ripped bedding is removed immediately and replaced
- Parents asked prior to children starting Nursery if their child has allergies to washing detergent and if so, appropriate precautions taken – such as parents supplying and washing own bedding.

Staff

- Follow safe supervision procedures during rest periods
- Complete monitoring checks and records accurately
- Maintain a safe and calm sleep environment
- Respond to children’s individual rest needs
- Raise any concerns immediately with the room lead or DSL

Leaders

- Monitor implementation of this policy
- Review sleep records
- Ensure staff training remains current
- Undertake periodic environment checks

Parent’s wishes

The preferences and wishes of parents are always valued and staff work closely with them to ensure each child’s individual needs are carefully met. Some parents prefer their children to only have a short sleep, fearing that a longer sleep will infringe on their child’s night-time sleep. Any parent’s wishes will be considered provided that these wishes are in the child’s best interests.

Monitoring and review

This policy is monitored by the governing body, and will be reviewed in two years, or earlier if necessary.

This policy also applies to Raindrops, Breakfast Club and After School Club
