This is a dip from 0.02 from 2016/17. In writing, in 2017/18 -2.41 in writing compared to 0.1 in 2016/17.</p> <p>80% of PPG pupils achieved the standard in writing. This is above the national average. 60% in reading and mathematics is in line with national averages.</p> <p>At the end of KS1 (4 pupils including 2 SEN): 25% in reading and mathematics achieved standard; 50% in writing.</p> <p>In phonics (4 pupils including 1 EAL), 80% achieved in Y1. Y2 (4 pupils including 2 SEN) 50% achieved phonics standard by end Y2.</p> <p>In EYFS (2 children), 100% achieved good level of development.</p>
