Charging Policy

Governors have agreed some increase in prices for Breakfast Club, After School Club and Raindrops Sessions due to increased costs for school. They have also introduced a contribution from parents of £2 per session towards swimming transport costs for Y4-Y6 children during the term that they have swimming sessions. This is because transport costs have more than doubled and the cost is now more than £8 per pupil per day for swimming transport. Details are in the revised Charging Policy which website on the under Information/policies.

SATS Results

We are very pleased with our KS2 SATs results. The children worked really hard and they have made very good progress despite the pandemic.

Attainment in reading: 81% at expected standard and/or greater depth standard; 40% at greater depth standard. National average 74%.

Attainment in writing: 81% at expected standard and/or greater depth standard; 19% greater depth standard. National average 69%

Attainment in maths: 77% expected standard and/or greater depth standard; 35% greater depth standard. National average 71%

Changes for September School Uniform

Children need to bring their PE and games kits in a PE **pump** bag on the first day to remain in school. Do not send in back packs – thank you.

PE Kit: red shorts (not tight fitting lycra), plain white t shirt or PE t-shirt with school logo. Please also provide black plimsolls.

Games Kit:

On top of PE kit, children should have **plain** black, long sleeved zip up hoodie (no logo) and **plain** black jogging bottoms (no logo). Children will also need a **pair of trainers** to remain in school.

Please do not invest in branded PE items – children will not be allowed to wear them as PE kits. Please do not invest in back packs also as the school does not have room to store them and they will be sent home. Thank you.

Children can continue to wear their summer uniforms if they wish until autumn half term.

Pencil cases

We requested pencil cases during Covid to reduce sharing equipment between children. This is no longer needed. Children will not need pencil cases – we will provide pencils, rubbers, rulers etc. Please leave pencil cases at home.

Book bags

Children can carry books and homework in book bags please. These fit neatly into school trays. These can be purchased through the uniform suppliers: Whittakers or Jaymax. Please do not send in back packs.
