# **Dojo Messages**

We have asked parents to contact teachers via Dojo to avoid talking at the school However, this has door. resulted in a massive number of personal messages that teachers are having to deal with daily. This is adding significantly to workload when teachers' workload has already increased with new ways of working required by the current pandemic, for example preparing and uploading materials for children selfisolating.

I understand that parents really appreciate constant connection with teachers via the system but this has become unmanageable.

We will be able to receive Dojo messages which we will acknowledge. However, teachers will not be expected to respond in length to parents in this way.

Teachers will wear masks at drop off and pick up times for very brief, urgent messages at the door.

Autumn parents' meetings are being arranged via TEAMS. This information has been sent separately.

### Children's birthdays

We have been thinking about how we can make a child's birthday special when it is on a day when they have to come into school. Just for this year, with Covid restrictions, if a child's birthday is on a school day then they can wear their own clothes for that day. This is instead of sending in sweets as we are trying to limit things being brought in from home. Thanks for your support.
